Founded in 1980, the National Coalition for Redress/Reparations is celebrating its tenth year as a leading force in campaign for redress. Each year, NCRR has organized a "Day of Remembrance" program to commemorate the signing of Executive Order 9066 on February 19, 1942. The Day of Remembrance programs have served to reaffirm the commitment of the organization to seek justice for those incarcerated during World War II.

Working together with the Japanese American Citizens League, the National Council for Japanese American Redress, and others, NCRR saw redress become a reality when the recent entitlement legislation was approved late last year. This victory is a testament to the dedication and perseverance of the entire Japanese American community and other justice-minded supporters.

NCRR will be continuing in its educational efforts to insure that the lessons of the camps are not lost on future generations. NCRR is also looking forward to the future in continuing as a civil rights and advocacy organization.
